Who is eligible for this service?

- Anyone who cannot see well enough to read standard print
- Anyone who cannot hold a book and turn the pages

How do I apply?

- Contact the Talking Book Library for an application, or download one from our web site.
- The application must be signed by competent authority to verify that you are eligible for the service.



What materials are available?

We have the same types of materials you would find in your local public library, including both fiction and non-fiction for children, teens, adults, and seniors.

- The new Digital Talking Book program starts in the Summer of 2009 and will offer Digital books recorded on flash cartridges to go with the new Digital player
- A Digital Download program called BARD will be available for those with a computer and high speed internet service
- Cassette books—recorded at a special speed
- Braille books from Frankfort
- Cassette and Braille magazine subscriptions and digital downloads



How does it work?

- We provide the special Players needed to listen to Talking Books.
- All materials are mailed via the U.S. Postal Service.
- You may use catalogs to choose books, or may ask your librarian to select for you.
- We will send as many or as few books as you can read.
- When you finish a book, simply return it and we will send another automatically.
- The service, player, catalog, and all postage are FREE!
